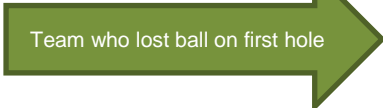

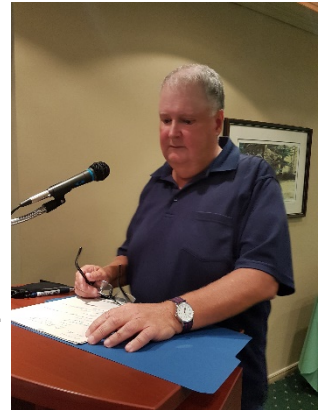

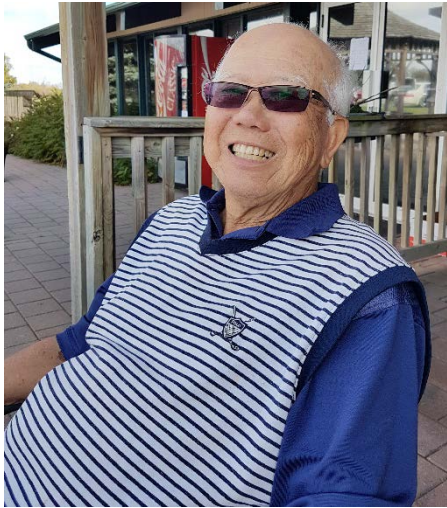

A totally riveting **Annual General Meeting** was held after the Closing Tournament.

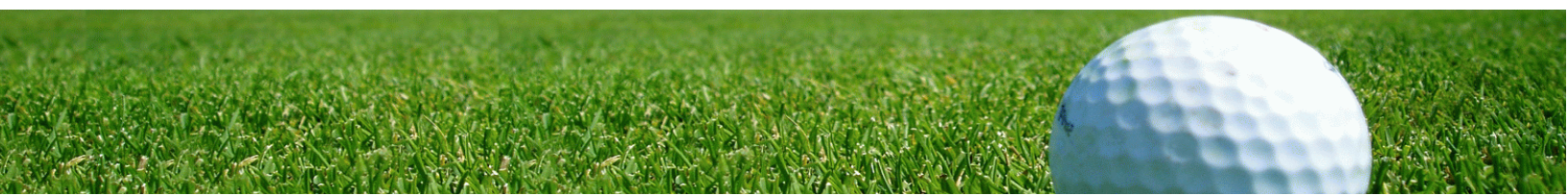
Your new executive was elected, financial report tabled, and various reports were received.

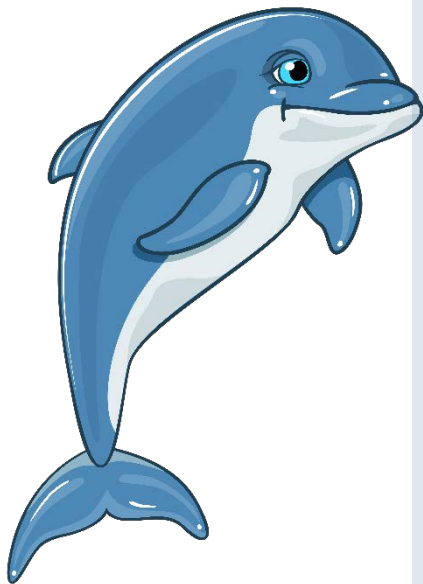
