This has come as very upsetting news to most of my buddies at the golf club, as none of us had any idea that we were Japanese

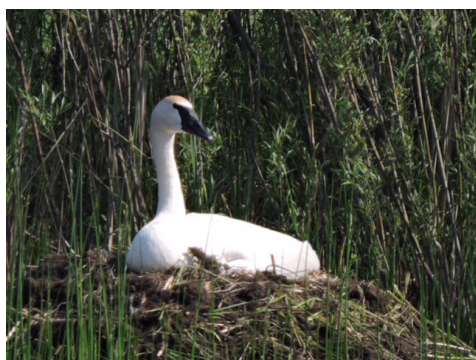


You would have thought a hole-in-one!

The incubation period, after the final egg is laid, is 32 to 37 days, handled mainly by the female, although occasionally by the male as well.

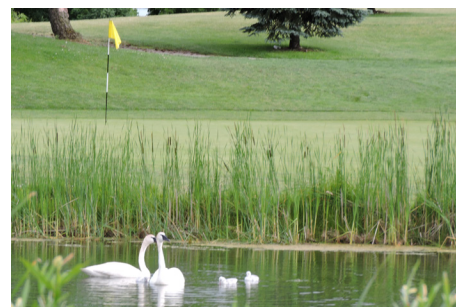

Reminder - Entering Scores for “holes not played”

When you miss a hole, or holes for whatever reason, (weather, skipping ahead, etc.) for “holes not played” you still need to enter your score.

The score that should be used is par for that hole plus and handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive on that hole. To use this rule the player must have completed a minimum of 7 holes to post a 9 hole score and a minimum of 13 holes to post an 18 hole score.

Golf Canada (not DMA) say you can't enter a score if you play on your own.

Have you heard about the white robin on the 6th and 7th hole? A few photos were sent in that looked like a white speck on green. Then **Stu Payne** went stealth and got close enough to get this shot. It looks remarkably like the same type of bird I spilled paint on last year when painting the house!
